What You Can Do To Help!

1. Tell everyone you know about DeMOLAY, Rainbow, and Scouting programs

- a. Be an ambassador for the youth programs in your area.
- b. Have your son, daughter, grandson or granddaughter join one of these groups.

2. Support an existing Chapter, Assembly, or Troop

- a. Attend meetings of your local Chapter or Assembly.
- b. **Masters,** assign one or your officers to attend each of the meetings of your local Chapter, Assembly or Troop.
- c. **Attend** the Installation of Officers of a local Chapter, Assembly or visit an Eagle Court of Honor. Bring your lodge or district to visit a youth group to show you care and they are important to our community.
- d. **Invite** a youth group to meet in your Masonic Apartments.
- e. **Provide** polo shirts, jackets, sweatshirts or ball caps with logos to a Chapter or Assembly.

3. Be an advisor

a. DeMolay and Rainbow need your support at their meetings. If you cannot make the meetings on a regular basis, you could offer your assistance for an event. Maybe your interest is in ritual, awards, athletics, providing collations, or helping with a service project. You can also help with the youth finances, Masonic awareness, driving to an event, or even program planning. There are lots of opportunities to help on a full or part-time basis.

4. Sponsor a prospect party

- a. See Membership Recruitment Tools on the Massachusetts DeMolay web site for planning assistance.
- b. The event should be fun and informative for both the young people as well as their parents. (Example: Bowling followed by a pizza party at the lodge.)

5. Start a new Chapter, Assembly or Scout Troop

a. Massachusetts DeMolay has a New Chapter Start-up Guide which you can download from their website. It could be adapted for Rainbow as well but please confirm with Miss Sandra J. Marshall (supinspect@verizon.net) about specific requirements for their program.

6. Fundraising

- a. Invite a youth group to serve a dinner and make a contribution to that group.
- b. Promote and support their fundraising activities in your Lodge and District.
- c. Make certain the activities of the youth are communicated to your Lodge.

7. Service opportunities

- a. Invite the youth to participate in your Installation by presenting the colors or handing out programs.
- b. Have them serve a dinner.
- c. Invite them to help with spring cleanup of your lodge.

8. Camperships

- a. Send one or more boys to DeMolay Leadership Training Camp.
- b. Send one or more girls to Rainbow Camp.

c. Send one or more boys to Scout Camp or High Adventure trips.

9. Sponsor members to attend the annual state session

- a. Send one or more boys to DeMolay Conclave (August).
- b. Send one or more girls to Grand Assembly (June).

10. Scholarships

a. Provide one or more college scholarships.

11. Invite a youth group to Lodge or LOI to confer a degree or ceremony

- a. DeMolay (Initiatory Degree, DeMolay Degree, Flower Talk, Mother Degree, Ceremony of Lights)
- b. Rainbow (Initiation, Heritage Degree, Fathers Talk, Fun Degree)
- c. Scouting (Flag Presentations)

12. Recognition

a. Recognize an outstanding DeMolay, Rainbow, or Scout with a special night, a plaque, or donation to a charity in their name.

13. Sports

a. Challenge one of the youth groups to a sporting event such as bowling, basketball, or softball.

14. BSA Eagle programs

- a. Pay for Eagle Kits.
- b. Masonic presence at an Eagle Ceremony:
 - i. Send a "Certificate of Recognition" on behalf your Lodge.
 - ii. Have your Lodge and/or District attend the Ceremony.
 - iii. Procure and present "Certificate of Recognition" from the Grand Master.
 - iv. Procure and present the "Trail to Eagle" Sebastian.

15. Join the National Association of Masonic Scouters

16. Join the Massachusetts Masonic Eagle Scout Association (MMESA)

a. Invite a MMESA member to speak to your lodge about Scout programs.

DeMolay International



What is DeMolay International?

"DeMolay is a fraternal youth group for young men from 12-21 years old. DeMolay members run the show -- they decide what they want to do, when they want to do it, and how they'll pay for it. Adult advisors exist to give advice, to provide rides, and to make sure everything the members want to do is safe and legal!

DeMolay is built on general principles designed to teach its members important life skills such as leadership, respect for themselves and others, and patriotism. Members aren't hammered over the head with these principles; rather, advisors and older members lead by example and teach these principles mainly by deeds and not words.

DeMolay Chapters exist in the United States, Canada, and several other countries. Millions of young men have been members of DeMolay. Men like Walt Disney, Walter Cronkite, Dan Rather, astronauts, government officials, business leaders, and other decent, honest men were DeMolays."

The Massachusetts Masonic Eagle Scout Association was established under the direction of Most Worshipful Roger William Pageau, Grand Master of Masons in Massachusetts in 2009 for the purpose of providing a Masonic presence at Boy Scouts of America Eagle Scout Courts of Honor, as well as to establish a network of Masonic Eagle Scouts in the Grand Jurisdiction of Massachusetts.

The immediate goals of MMESA are to accomplish the following:

- 1. Provide an active presence at Eagle Scout Courts of Honor, either through a Grand Lodge presence, a local Lodge presence, or through members of MMESA, for the purpose of presenting a framed certificate signed by the Grand Master, as well as the Grand Masters coin, and a Grand Lodge Eagle Scout Sebastian collectable.
- 2. Establish a database of Masons in Massachusetts that are Eagle Scouts

These goals will expand over time to help develop MMESA into an active component of the Grand Lodge family, providing an opportunity for Eagle Masons to connect with one another, help with Eagle Courts of Honor, as well as promote the connections of Scouting and Masonry.
